## 3 Tokoname Manekineko-dori

Tokoname is among the most prominent production centers for "manekineko" in Japan. From Meitetsu Tokoname to the start point of the pottery trails there are 39 lucky manekineko and Tokonyan the guardian cat to welcome you.

### 16 INAX Live Museum (part of LIXIL)

## 1000 years of Tokoname-ware history

Tokoname-ware boasts a history of about one thousand years and is counted among the six ancient kilns of Japan (Seto, Shigaraki, Echizen, Tamba, Bizen and Tokoname). Medieval Tokoname was the largest of these ceramic producing areas. Old Tokoname is a term applied to bottles and jars used in daily life baked in the Heian period. With production of tiles ramped up in the Taisho Period, Tokoname cemented its position as a city of pottery.
