
TOKONAME










Pottery Trails: Area B Course

1000 years of Tokoname-ware history

Tokoname-ware boasts a history of about one thousand years and is counted among the six ancient kilns of Japan (Seto, Shigaraki, Echizen, Tamba, Bizen and Tokoname). Medieval Tokoname was the largest of these ceramic producing areas. Old Tokoname is a term applied to bottles and jars used in daily life baked in the Heian period. With production of tiles ramped up in the Taisho Period, Tokoname cemented its position as a city of pottery.








D Boat Race Tokoname










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
Reikei no Sato Area
